Rationale for Collective Worship


We consider collective worship to be an integral and essential part of our whole school Vision, ethos and curriculum. It is broadly Christian in nature and inclusive of all pupils. It is a time when the school community can express itself and develop spiritually both as a group and individually. Each half term we use our gateways to guide us through a set of underpinning Christian values. We use the Roots and Fruits Christian values (green) and our Gateway values (purple) to ensure our values led approach to worship is intertwined and linked to our curriculum. All worships will have a theological approach, explaining how the gospels reveal the way in which Jesus embodied these values.

Our Acts of Worship are delivered in a manner which makes it inclusive for all pupils.



This story reminds us that we can **achieve and flourish** with the gifts that God gave us. We should invest our talents wisely and not waste them.


